#### Ivan Voinov '13 Composition to be Performed



Music-COMP (Music Composition Online Mentoring Program) has selected Ivan Voinov's composition, titled *The Norse Clockmaker*, to be added to the programming for the upcoming concerts on November 10<sup>th</sup> in Montpelier and November 11<sup>th</sup> in Burlington.

This performance is a collaborative effort between Music-COMP and The Vermont Contemporary Music Ensemble (VCME). VCME is a professional group dedicated to perform rarely-heard 20th and 21st century music and works by living composers. Music-COMP supports students in composing music by connecting them with professional composers in an online mentoring forum. The project also develops

resources for composition and supports live performances of student work. Ivan's submission, *The Norse Clockmaker*, is a piece for flute, violin I, violin II, cello and contrabass.
