United Way of Chittenden County and Vermont Department of Health Continue the Governor's Forum on Opiate Addiction

July 16, 2014 (South Burlington, VT) - United Way of Chittenden County and Vermont Department of Health will cohost a Chittenden County community conversation following the Governor's June 16 community forum on opiate addiction at the Vermont Statehouse.

This follow up community meeting will be held on August 5th from 8:30AM - noon at the Vermont Commons School at 75 Green Mountain Drive in South Burlington, VT, just off Shelburne Road behind IDX. This meeting will convene partnerships to begin building a coordinated, community-wide strategy to address heroin and opiate addiction in Chittenden County.

Following the governor's state-wide forum United Way of Chittenden County is facilitating continued discussion and action. "The proliferation of substance abuse is a community problem – if we're going to solve it we all have to own it," said United Way of Chittenden County Executive Director, Martha Maksym. "With increased public awareness has come a surge of willful energy from citizens and organizations throughout the state to get involved. The development of prevention strategies is a key focus for United Way in 2014 as part of their work to advance health and well being in Chittenden County.
