The VYVA has been running and organizing the league and championships for almost a decade, and those achievements and championships that VCS has earned are part of the history of VT Volleyball forever.

The official sanctioning will mean very little (directly) to VCS, but it means a great deal to the state, as it paves the way for equal budgets (coaches, transportation, equipment, etc) for volleyball teams. This means more and more schools will begin to play, and we will have to divide into size-appropriate divisions in the future. Last week, that journey ended with the unanimous support of the Vermont Principal's Association.

The commitment that Vermont Commons Volleyball student-athletes and their families have shown our team and the sport as a whole has benefitted the whole state. Well done Flying Turtles!


Varsity Boys' Playoffs

On the boys' side, we hosted a quarterfinal match versus the Enosburg Hornets. Having beaten them in our two previous matches (including a 3-0 sweep at Senior Day), we entered the contest confident of advancing to the semifinals at Essex.

The match can be summed up like this; Eli makes a perfect pass, and then Ryan sets either Danny in the middle for a thunderous lefty-kill or Mason on the outside for a slashing spike through the defense. Whenever the Hornets returned a ball, Xavier, Graham, or Jake were there on defense, blocking and digging. After going up two sets, we only had to win one of the next three.

The tough-minded and well-coached Hornets adjusted their gameplan and got the score to 26-26 (set to 25 points, but win-by-two). Your Flying Turtles did not fold under the pressure and went on to win the set (28-26) and match.

Next up, the semifinals. Essex was the 2-time defending State Champions, undefeated this season posting a 21-2 set record (with one of those two losses to VCS the week before). Essex was ready for the Danny/Mason combo and paid them the ultimate hitter's compliment by regularly triple-blocking them. EHS got two close set victories to go up 2-0....and then Xavier stepped to the service line at 18-18.

Some backstory; each coach gets two timeouts per set and they are generally used to disrupt the timing of a server (because it usually works). Xavier served 4 straight points (mostly unreturnable aces) and Essex called a timeout to ice the XMan...to no avail. At 24-18 they called another timeout, but the IcyX calmly stepped to the service line and iced the pesky wee little arthropods.

EHS rallied to win the set & match. There's no question that the better team won the day; there's equally no question that the boys' team reached a new level of play, and I believe have to be considered favorites to make it to the State Championship match next season.

Again, we offer our sincere thanks to seniors Eli Hinds and Josh Wolfstein for all they've brought to this team over their careers.

All-Vermont Team

For the fourth year (since 2012), The Vermont Youth Volleyball Association organizes the selection of an All-Vermont (aka "All-League") team. During the regular season, opposing coaches nominate players. Before the State Championship, coaches vote to narrow the field to about 10 boys and 10 girls. From within that group, one player is recognized for sportsmanship and is elected as Captain of the All-Vermont team.

This year, the VT Volleyball coaching community selected VCS senior co-captain Anna Leffler as the top setter in the State. Also on the team, a trio of Juniors who were recognized as among the best in the state; co-captain Mason Hill, Danny Watson, and Amira Silverman (both Mason and Amira are now 3-time All-VT teamers). Next up for the All-Vermont team, a match against the New Hampshire All-Star team (TBA)

While Mason was a clear choice for hitter and Anna received all of the first-place votes for the setting position, even more impressive is the respect accorded to them by the coaching community. All 25 of the nominated girls (and 18 of the nominated boys) were eligible to be selected as the All-Vermont Captain, based solely on demonstrated sportsmanship. Anna and Mason both received 1st, 2nd, or 3rd –place votes from every coach. That is who we are, and why VCS Volleyball is still considered the benchmark against which all other programs are measured.

Future

Middle School March Madness

Keep an eye open for the Middle-School March Madness mini-season. Hundreds of middle schoolers from all over Vermont tried Volleyball for the first time last spring, and we will run the program again. Several of this year's rising stars (Austin, Phoebe, Heloise...) got their first taste of Volleyball by taking part in this program.

VYVA Offseason

The VYVA will once again be offering clinics and scrimmages to new programs. We will need VCS veterans AND first-timers to help us run those events around the state. We will continue to offer youth tournaments and leagues, so be sure to keep an eye on the VYVA Facebook page.

New Teams

At a meeting last week, we learned about several new schools that will be playing next year; St. Johnsbury Academy (Boys & Girls), BFA (Boys & Girls), and South Burlington High School (Boys & Girls). MMU, Colchester High, and Milton will be bringing in girls' teams as well.
